## Bishop Jude Speyrer Hermitage House opens

MOSS BLUFF - The repurdence of the late Bishop Jude Speyrer - the Bishop Jude Speyrer Hermitage House has provided Saint Charles Center with the opportunity to offer more private directed retreats for individuals clergy, religious and laity. The ability to use the house helps fill a need for which director Father Whitney Miller had seen more and more of a call recently.

Bishop Glen John Provost blessed and dedicated the Bishop Jude Speyrer Hermitage House recently. Reservations are now being accepted for use of the Hermitage House by calling the Center, according to Father Whitney Miller, director.

"We started getting more and more calls requesting that sort of space," Father Miller said. "We are thankful to God that our schedule is very full now and there is very little space on our calendar that would allow us to bump a group of people for one person. I can't put one person in here (Tabor Retreat House) when I have an ACTS group wanting to, so it was a way to pastorally meet both of those needs.

"Respecting those who had signed up for the calendar and filled it up, you know we are scheduling now 18 months out, and at the same time the residence did come available," he continued. "Knowing him like I did, I felt that Bishop Speyrer would feel really happy about using the house that way. I think the house for him was a place of refuge and prayerfulness and contemplation and continuing to use the house in that way was a really good use. And, it met a need here."

She has authored several books and spoken around the globe on marriage, family and sexuality and was named one of the "Catholic Stars of 2013" by Our Sunday Visitor a list that also included Pope Francis and Pope Benedict
