



Willa Golden named Distinguished Catholic of Year

LAKE CHARLES – Mrs. Willa Golden, a parishioner of Sacred Heart of Jesus Catholic Church in Lake Charles, was recently named the “Distinguished Catholic of the Year” by St. Peter Claver Court and Council #168 of St. Henry Catholic Church at the recent Sapphire and Ice Gala fundraiser.

Mrs. Golden holds degrees from McNeese State University (Bachelor of Music Education – 1966) Master of Music Education, McNeese – 1968), Education Specialist (McNeese – 1974), and Master of Theology (Xavier University of New Orleans - 2004). She holds the singular distinction of being the first African American woman to earn a graduate degree in music education. She attended elementary and secondary schools in Lake Charles and graduated from Sacred Heart High School.

She has served as the music educator at Our Lady’s School in Sulphur for the past seven years as well as Our Lady of Prompt Succor’s music director for the previous three years.

Mrs. Golden was nominated by Father Richard for the honor.

“She has contributed to our parish and school by her wonderful presence but also her dedication and zeal for the education of our youth in music, specifically liturgical singing. She has a profound love for teaching the children to sing for the liturgy.

“In these years of working with Mrs. Golden, she has made the sacrifice of driving over to Sulphur to work with the school and the parish,” Father Richard continued. “One is struck by the outstanding quality of the children’s singing at Holy Mass. Indeed, one would never think that such young children could sing as they do here, especially at the celebrations for the school. I would also like to point out that Mrs. Golden

is a genuinely kind person, professional in every way. In her demeanor, she exemplifies the type of person whom others should emulate in their service to the Church. She is respectful but would not hesitate to speak out for the sake of the common good.”

Mrs. Golden has volunteered in her parish and the Diocese of Lake Charles in numerous positions over her years of service to the Church, including that of parish Director of Religious Education along with many other duties.

Trevor Donnelly, Principal of Our Lady’s School, also expressed his support for the nomination of Mrs. Golden.

“For well over 40 years, she has served in many capacities at her home parish, including the directorship of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, Ladies Auxiliary of the Knights of St. Peter Claver, Fourth Degree Ladies of Grace, director of various choirs, the Liturgical Commission, Parish Council, and as a facilitator of regional retreats,” Donnelly said. “She is a dedicated music educator who has had a profound impact on students at Our Lady’s School, just as she has in the public school of Calcasieu Parish, and within her own parish. She is a consummate professional, who is committed to evangelizing the love of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I am privileged to support her.”

Proceeds from the event will be used to support college-level seminarians studying for the priesthood of the Diocese of Lake Charles and the St. Henry Catholic Church’s *Building Bridges* Capital Campaign, which is in its second year.

Pastors of the church parishes of the Diocese of Lake Charles were asked to nominate an individual for the award, with St. Henry serving as host for the gala.

KC Council 1207 named Triple Star Council

LAKE CHARLES—Cathedral Council 1207, Knights of Columbus, has received the distinction of Triple Star Council, the international organization’s top award for local councils.

The Star Council award recognizes overall excellence in the areas of membership, promotion of the fraternal insurance program, and sponsorship of service-oriented activities. The Triple Star Council award recognizes councils that receive Star Council and also have reached 300 percent of the membership quota.

The award was presented to Grand Knight Stephen Broussard and the membership by Knights of Columbus Diocesan Administrator Troy Rizzuto. Only three councils out of the 310 councils in the state of Louisiana received the honor of Triple Star Council!

Council 1207 was originally chartered with 39 members on March 10, 1907, according to information provided by the office of the KC Supreme Council. Due to lack of membership the council went inactive Oct. 10, 1999, the Supreme Council records indicate. Those members still active were transferred to the KC Council at Our Lady Queen of Heaven Catholic Church.

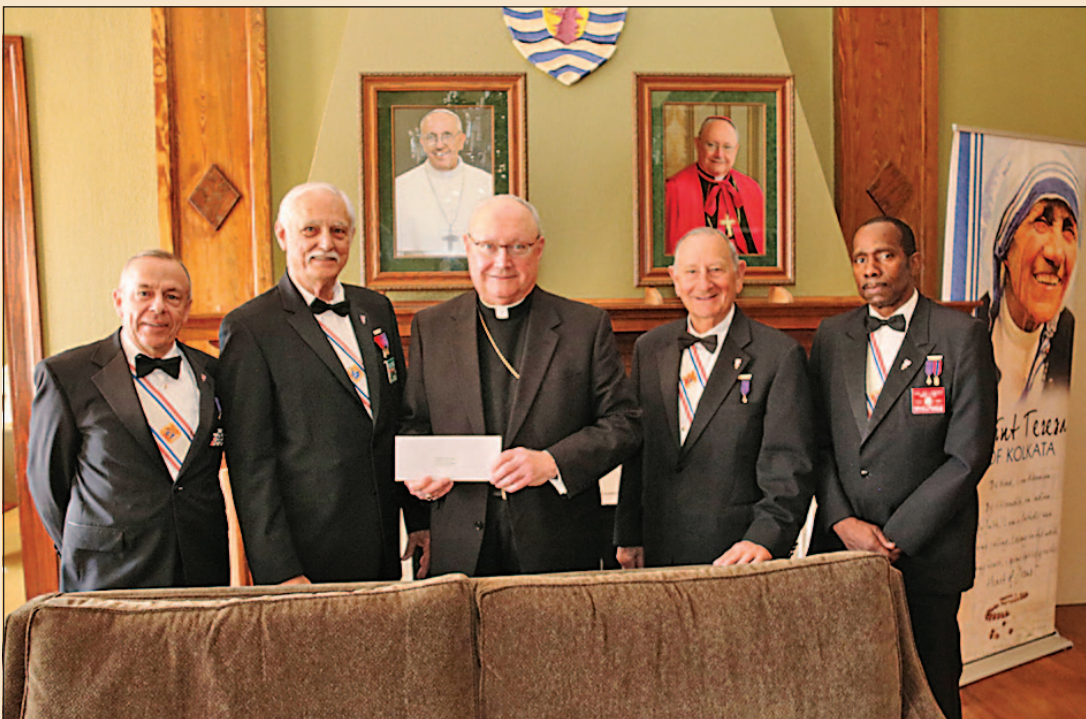
The council was reactivated about three years ago and now has a roster of 58 members.

- Assisting with construction of Habitat for Humanity homes.
- Providing concessions (barbeque hamburgers, etc.) at the annual priest versus Seminarians kick-ball games.
- Assisting with processions to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima.
- Sponsoring quarterly pulled pork sandwich fundraisers.
- Providing meat entrees and other assistance at the cathedral’s spring and fall picnic.
- Sponsoring its inaugural KCs and Corks wine tasting fundraiser.
- Assisting with periodic clean-up sessions of the cathedral as well as the old Catholic Cemetery.

With more than 1.9 million members, the Knights of Columbus is the world’s largest Catholic lay organization. It provides members and their families with volunteer opportunities in service to the Catholic Church, the community, families, and young people. In 2016, the Knights of Columbus at all levels of the organization raised and distributed \$177,500,673 million to charity and rendered 75 million hours of volunteer service.
