

Cathedral radio broadcast suspended

Center for Catholic Studies class schedule

LAKE CHARLES - Father Nathan Long will teach on the Letters of St. Paul Course Title: The Letters of Saint Paul on the Tuesdays of January 29 and February 12, 19, 26 from 5:30-7:30 p.m. at the Catholic Student Center at McNeese.

The course description is as follows: "St. Paul is notoriously misunderstood. St. Peter admitted as much in his own letter (2 Peter 3:15-16). Yet, understanding St. Paul is critical if we are to take seriously the call to evangelize. After all, Paul was the first world-wide evangelizer. Moreover, his epistles are read throughout the year in the Sacred Liturgy. Few pay much attention, and they are rarely given attention from the pulpit. In the interest of making the most of a short time, the approach in this course will be to take 8 keys/keywords to recall the central ideas and themes in Paul. By developing an understanding in these topics, it will better equip the participant to hear and understand the sections of Paul's epistles as they are read at Mass.'
